Gutters are always a problem first time you do them but this is **our** method. Start at the front after making a cut out to go round the T rubber. Drill and tack every 4" using 5/64 drill bit and 1" galvanised wire nails or equivalent. At the corner use 2 tacks close together. Bend the gutter round the corner about 30 degrees then cut a 3/4" section out of the bottom lip only. Using a small wood or plastic drift form the gutter roung the corner drilling and tacking every 1/2". Continue to the centre tacking about every 2".Cut off excess gutter at the centre of the rear roof at a slight angle. This will make it easier to get a good fit when joining the second section

has been folded over. Do not hit too hard or too fast as you will ripple the gutter. Finally tap down the very top lip of the gutter to flatten to the roof. There is a ridge about 1/8" from the top.

To fold the top use a piece of wood or plastic 8" long with rounded off ends. Tap gently working backwards and forwards until the lip

To get a good finish make sure the roof was perfectly flat to start with and be patient. Do not try and flatten too hard to the roof. Make sure the gutter is the right way up. Bigger section to the bottom. Top section is designed to fold easily.
